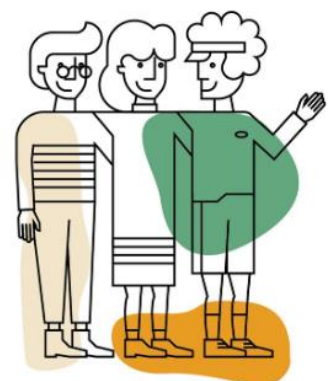
### Job Description for Music Therapist
